

Act 3 of Parliament Creation of Currency

Government of Wiltogo



By order of the King and by the justification of both the High Court and Parliament, the official currency of Wiltogo has been declared.

The Ministry of Economics, Parliament, the High Court, and the King, have come to the conclusion that the currency of Wiltogo will be time based. Thus, beginning a month after the printing of the currency, the country of Wiltogo will have an economy that uses bills that are based off of hours of work. Therefore, each item is worth how long the worker spent creating it and each service is worth how long the worker spent working at his job. However, it is possible for services and items to fluctuate in their price according to how the worker believes each is truly worth. Nevertheless, the King, with the justification from Parliament and the High Court, can have the price of a service or an item decreased if he feels the citizens are being overcharged. The King, along with the consent of the majority of Parliament, may lower the wage or increase the wages on citizens according to how poorly or how well they are working. Members of Parliament and leaders of Government Agencies will be paid by how long each worked on their specific objective or goal. Yet, the King will have the final say on the income each member receives. Lastly, education will be free for all. Teachers and educational workers will be paid by the government.
